Message from our Mayor!

Welcome back to "the lake". With an early fall and cold winter, here's hoping we have some great weather for summer! On behalf of Council, I'd like to update you on the things we've been working on over this winter.

First, I want to thank Emily House our new Chief Administrative Officer. She is very organized, has a lot of Municipal Government experience and has truly made the transition to our Village seamlessly. Council and the Village are very fortunate to have her. Emily, your efforts are greatly appreciated.

Under the amendments to the Municipal Government Act of a couple of years ago, the Village has many new requirements to comply with including Inter Municipal Collaboration Frameworks, Inter Municipal Development Plans and our own Municipal Development Plan. With Emily's capable help, Council has been working to meet these new requirements. A significant example is the Municipal Development Plan that we will be consulting with Villagers on during the summer. This is a high-level set of objectives and policies that will outline the Village's commitment to the environment and lake stewardship and will set the principles for responsible redevelopment within the Village. The Municipal Development Plan will shape refinements to our Land Use Bylaw which

Council has been considering. We look forward to your feedback on this plan.

Council has also been working on revising our Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw. Our current bylaw is very old and needs to be updated to reflect the current needs of the Village. We will be sharing the draft Bylaw at the Annual Information Meeting and seeking your written feedback for Council's consideration in finalizing the new Bylaw.

I want to say a special thanks to our Security Committee, Dave and Wendy Wiles, John McIvor, Derek Onysko, Leah Izquierdo and Emily House. They have been working hard on sorting out the issues with our cameras. Derek Onysko will be presenting some information at the Annual Information Meeting on how we can all better secure our properties. The Committee is making good progress on the complex matter.

With respect to the legal challenge to Wapameg Avenue and the footpath, the case was heard by the Court of Appeal on May 1 and the panel reserved judgement. Council is optimistic the court will uphold the original decision when the decision is released.

I also want to thank my fellow Councillors, Deputy Mayor John McIvor and Councillor Tim Kirby. Their hard work and commitment contributes significantly to the success of our Village.

2019 Property Assessment and Taxes

It's that time of year again. You will find enclosed with this newsletter, your 2019 Combined Property Assessment and Tax Notice.

Please note that the **ASSESSED VALUE** for your property is as of **July 1st, 2018**. We highly recommend each resident closely examine their Property Assessment and speak with the assessor regarding it. The Assessment Complaint Deadline is July 31, 2019.

PROPERTY TAXES are DUE JUNE 30, 2019 by midnight.

Penalties will not be applied if the Village receives your payment on or before June 30, 2019 or if the post mark on your envelope is June 30, 2019.

A 18% penalty on your current tax levy will be applied on July 1, 2019. On January 1, 2019 an additional 18% penalty will be applied on the complete outstanding amount (previous and current tax levy and penalties).

Warning Buoys

We are looking at replacing the buoys this year that will be again in place in Kapasiwin Bay as a demarcation line for users of watercraft in the bay. We ask residents and guests that when using motorized watercraft, please leave your boat launch or dock and head straight out past the buoys before engaging your activities. The area from the beach to the buoy demarcation line is reserved for swimmers, canoeing and paddleboats, tubers and rowboats giving them a safe place to enjoy the lake environment.

Fire Smart – Help Protect Your Property

This year, with the dry conditions and the number of fires that have occurred, the Village would like to provide some helpful strategies that you can implement on your property to help reduce the risk of wildfire affecting your property.

- Do not store firewood beside buildings including houses or sheds
- Trim trees where branches are touching buildings or the ground
- Clear branches and leaves from rooftops and gutters
- Clear debris piles, dead branches and leaves from properties

As we move into the fire season, the Summer Village will continuously monitor conditions and consult with Parkland County regarding fire bans and advisories. Historically, we have followed the fire ban status of Parkland County; however, Council may wish to issue their own bans for the Village as well.

In all cases, the fire ban status of the Village will be updated on the Village website for quick reference.

Be a Responsible Pet Owner

We would like to applaud the residents who respect their neighbors and community and clean up after their pets.

Council is currently reviewing our Dog Bylaw and have drafted the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw which will be presented at our Annual Information Meeting for written input from residents.

Please Pick Up After Your Pet

A single gram of dog feces contains 23 million fecal coliform bacteria that harbour many more dangerous bacteria and viruses. **Dog feces kills plants and grass. Dog feces can pollute the environment and filter its way into water supplies. Dog feces left behind create an unattractive environment.**



Projects for 2019

After significant capital investment in many of the Village's assets including the community hall, security cameras, and tennis courts, Council has arranged for some minor road repairs on Railway Ave. With the development of the Security Committee we also have scheduled the next phase of the security camera project over the next year.

We are very fortunate to be in a very healthy capital grant position today; however, it seems uncertain at this time what future provincial grants will be available in the future. Council is carefully considering our future capital plans and community needs and wants and would welcome any input from residents on your views of these.

Moving forward Kapaswin has been focused on ensuring that we comply with the amended Alberta Municipal Government Act (MGA) this year. With this comes a number of documents that must be developed. One such requirement is for the Village to adopt a Municipal Development Plan. Council and Administration have been working diligently on this project with Municipal Planning Services and have successfully produced a draft of Kapasiwin's Municipal Development Plan which we will be presenting at the Public Open House on July 27th for your input and comments. This project is being funded through the Alberta Community Partnerships Grant that we were successful in securing.

Additionally, all municipalities within Alberta are required to develop and adopt Inter Municipal Development Plans and Inter Municipal Collaboration Frameworks with neighboring municipalities. Kapaswin is current working with Parkland County on these documents.

As mentioned at the 2018 Annual Information Meeting, Alberta Municipal Affairs also implemented a Municipal Accountability Program Audit which Kapaswin was a part of in August 2018. We are currently working on complying with the suggestions that Alberta Municipal Affairs made in their report and will be in full compliance by November 2019.

Additional projects this year will consist of continuing to work on amending the Land Use Bylaw and updating our Emergency Management Plan to conform to new legislation.

Developing and Building

A Development Permit must be applied for before obtaining any Safety Code Permits necessary for new construction, additions, decks, demolition, and excavation (HOLDING TANKS & CISTERNS). This permit is to ensure that your project or home occupation conforms to the Village's Land Use ByLaw, including proper setbacks from property lines, etc.

Our Development Officer, Tony Sonnleitner, can be reached at 780-718-5479. A Real Property Report, showing the location of existing buildings and the proposed development must be submitted when applying. Application fees must accompany all Development Applications.

Safety Code Permits including electrical, plumbing, building, etc. must be obtained from Inspections Group before beginning your project. You must apply for these permits to ensure that your project is safe and conforms to safety code regulations and must be obtained before commencing work.
